Notes from Kaitlin New Home Sales Division

After several delays we are now well underway with our 2012 building program. Phase 7 on Country Club Drive North has four newer resident families. A fifth home which backs on the 17th green and is already sold, is being framed. The footings are poured for four inventory homes and foundations are scheduled to be poured the week of October 8th. After the golf course closes, drainage work will be completed on the 12th hole which will enable us to start construction of a model home on Lot 2. Three additional inventory homes will be started later this year for completion in the spring.

One of the two inventory homes remaining on Country Club Drive South is currently under offer. The two remaining vacant lots will not be built on until the temporary ditch feeding the pond is filled in and replaced with underground drainage.

There has been significant interest in the Townhomes and construction has started on Block 6, backing on to County Road 7. Four of the five units in Block 6 are sold.

Mulrone Construction is currently installing services for the new Townhome phase as well as completing repairs to curbs in the first phase of Townhomes in preparation for the final lift of asphalt. Once services are installed and the extension of Country Club Drive and Britannia Crescent is paved, construction will start on Block 18 facing the golf course. Three of the four units in this block are sold. Construction on Block 17 will start later this fall.

Loyalist Author Provides Help for Seniors

When Shirley Roberts, a Loyalist resident, wrote her book, *Doris Inc.: a Business Approach to Caring for Your Elderly Parents*, she wanted to share the strategies she and her brother employed to provide the best possible care and quality of life for their mother, Doris, during her last five years.

Doris Inc. outlines these strategies and provides readers with a wealth of information about available help, having the tough family conversations that allow for forward planning, dealing with financial issues, finding the right living arrangements, working with health care providers, advocating for a loved one, and being able to find life balance while caregiving.

The book was launched in December 2011 and the impact has gone far beyond what Shirley expected. Her hope was that people would be able to use this resource in very practical ways and that has happened. Shirley relates the story of a woman who, having read Doris Inc., told her "I didn't know what I didn't know." She wanted copies for her children so they could read it and then together they could openly talk about and plan for her declining years.

However, the impact of Shirley's book has gone far beyond increased awareness by readers.

Support and/or endorsements for Doris Inc. have come from corporations, including Pfizer Canada, Extendicare Nursing Homes, Providence Care Hospital in Kingston, Princess Margaret Hospital Foundation, and BMO Financial Group.

Doris Inc. is on the reading list for a course called 'Aging and Society' offered to nursing students at Conestoga College, as part of the nursing course that grants a BNSc. degree at McMaster University. In 2013, Shirley will become a contributing blogger for Saint Elizabeth Home Health Care on the organization's **Care to Know Centre** website.
